Dear McKinley Families:

Fall is in the air! I can't believe we're in the month of October! Time flies!

Our teachers are working hard to provide a high quality educational experience for each child. As I visit classrooms, I've been observing students in a variety of settings (i.e. whole group, small group, 1:1). Students are happy, engaged and focused. Teachers are working hard to meet the diverse and unique needs of

each student. Students are engaged in close reading, differentiated small reading groups, summary writing, CGI math strategies, academic conferencing, words their way activities & so much more. Many teachers are asking students to set goals for themselves and teachers are continuously monitoring students' progress. We have an amazing school community who go above and beyond to support each student. If you have any questions regarding your child's curriculum, please see your child's teacher.

Our 1st literacy night is Wednesday at 6:45 pm. The TK-grade 1 presentation will be hosted by our literacy coach, Mary Scifres, in Room 100. The grade 2-5 presentation will be hosted by our literacy coach, Mike Ostrom, in our auditorium! This is a wonderful opportunity for you to get specific grade level information regarding your child's language arts curriculum. Babysitting will be provided in the cafeteria for ages 4 and up. Light refreshments will be provided. Hope to see you there!

The state testing results are in, and if your child is in grades 4-5, you should have received your son/daughter's results via mail. We now have a baseline for testing and our goal is to improve by 10% more students meeting/exceeding grade level standards next year. Grades 3-5 teachers met with an educational consultant to analyze the testing data, discuss strengths and areas of growth, set goals, share best practices and plan instruction. Grade K-2 teachers met with our site literacy coaches, Mary Scifres & Mike Ostrom to analyze district data, set goals & share best practices. The education consultant will be back in January to continue working with grade 3-5 teachers. Below is a summary of the results per grade level:

Grade 3	Math	64% met/exceeded standards	Language Arts	63% met/exceeded standards
Grade 4	Math	55% met/exceeded standards	Language Arts	58% met/exceeded standards
Grade 5	Math	41% met/exceeded standards	Language Arts	56% met/exceeded standards

This week is Bike It/Walk It Week (October 7-9). We hope you can participate by getting to school in a car free manner! Staff from the Office of Senator Ben Allen will distribute safety information on Wednesday before school. And Kind Bars will be distributed on Friday to those individuals who come to school in a car free-way (bike, walk, skate board, scooter, etc.). Hope you can join us by participating.



McKinley Elementary School TK/Kindergarten Forum

Sorry we missed you during our last TK/Kindergarten Forum! Here are some highlights from our discussion...

Your Child's Transition to Transitional Kindergarten/Kindergarten

- What has the Tk/K experience been like for your child and yourself?
- Several parents shared they have noticed a shift in their child's behavior at home, with some children using inappropriate terms/phrases learned outside of the home.
- A few parents highlighted their own struggles of separating from their child this school year.
- Many parents agreed on the overall difficulties of parenting and attempting to appropriately support their child's social-emotional growth.

Importance of Tk/K

- This is often the first time a child will be away from parents for a longer period of time, in a more structured classroom (with several peers), and increased behavioral expectations.
- It's a period of critical social-emotional growth, including the areas of: expression and management of emotion, pro-social behaviors, classroom behaviors, self confidence, and establishing positive relationships.
- Current research shows that *self-regulation of emotions/behavior* is one of the strongest predictors of academic success and leads to success in the workplace, social settings and overall in life.

How to Help your Child Learn to Identify and Express their Emotions

- Behaviors can tell you a lot! Children at this age may have difficulty verbalizing their feelings so
 adults can help children name their feelings and help him/her process those feelings.
 - o Ex: "I think you felt sad when your friend did not want to play with you."
- You can help your child practice identifying emotions in other children by playing games that focus
 on facial expressions, body language, social-scenarios, etc.
 - Ex: "Look at my face.... What do you think I may be feeling right now?"
- It's important to help your child identify their own positive coping tools ("coping toolkit") so they can learn appropriate ways to regulate their feelings. Examples include deep breathing, counting to 10, squeezing Play Doh, etc.

Supporting Social Interactions and Promoting Pro-Social Behavior

- Children often learn and express themselves through play so allowing them to do so is critical.
- Observe your child's interactions with peers and praise/guide them as necessary.
- Discuss expected behaviors at home, in the classroom and in the community at large. This can include age-appropriate discussions about family/cultural values.

Important Points to Remember

- Children are learning to regulate their feelings/behaviors, while navigating new social situations; therefore, they may engage in unexpected or inappropriate behavior at some point.
- Always remember children (and parents) are life-long learners and should be allowed to make
 mistakes sometimes. There is no such thing as a perfect child or parent [research shows you just
 have to be a "good enough" parent]!


Dear McKinley Families,


